About this Course

This content includes:

- A focus on skills needed for the whole job, and all the roles of a reflective supervisor.
- A focus on diversity, equity and inclusion, and the supervisor's use of critical selfreflection and social location.
- An infusion of the structure and materials from the FAN and RIOS, two welldeveloped models of structuring reflective practice and supervision.

Who is this course for?

Individuals who have completed introductory training and have experience providing reflective supervision. This training intensive will expand on those skills and deepen their supervisory practice.

What does Track 1: RS for the Whole Job training include?

- Eight virtual Learning Block sessions scheduled once a month for 2 to 4 hours
- Seven 90-minute small group community of practice sessions
- Approximately 17 hour of asynchronous learning work including reading, viewing video clips and reflective writing
