

About this Course

Track 2 provides participants with tools and skills to strengthen planning, administrative practices and structures that support full implementation of relationship-based reflective supervision and reflective practices within an organization or system.

Participants are asked to come with a team or partners from their organization, at least one of whom has completed the Track 1 training. They will be asked to identify a concern or problem in their organization or system to consider for change or enhancement.

This will become the focus of their work in the smaller Community of Learner sessions, where they can explore and apply ideas presented during the online group sessions.

Who is this course for?

Leaders and change agents in organizations that are interested in creating a culture of reflection in their organization.

For maximum benefit, one member of the organization should have completed Track 1 training.

Track 2: Supporting Implementation of Reflective Supervison within Agencies, Organizations & Systems

What does Track 2 training include?

- Six 3-hour online sessions on tools and skills to strengthen reflective supervision practices within an organization.
- Four 90-minute meetings that offer participants the opportunity to explore specific programmatic issues related to desired changes within their organization and to apply the ideas and practices offered during the online training.
- The opportunity to participate in an individual team mentoring session with the RSC faculty member facilitating their group to identify team goals and needs.
- Approximately 14 hours of asynchronous learning work including reading, viewing video clips and audio or written journaling to support integration of the written material into practice.
